



1. TAMANIQUE WATERFALLS

Overview: Tamanique Waterfalls, the perfect break from the warmth of La Libertad beaches. Tamanique is 600 m above the sea level, just 30 minutes away from La Libertad, it's the perfect destination for a half day tour or between morning and evening surf sessions. Tamanique is surrounded by a chain of mountains known as Cordillera del Balsamo that connects to the Pacific Ocean, which provides a delightful weather and perfect view of the Pacific Ocean. This area is very well known by Salvadorans for its green mountains and corn plantations. Tamanique is an indigenous name which means "The Taken Land".

The Tamanique Waterfalls is a complex of 4 waterfalls; you can jump off from 3 of them, and the fourth and final one is 50 meters high. There's a nice mini lagoon where you can swim and relax watching the water fall from the very top of the hill. During the visit to these amazing waterfalls, we also visit the park and catholic church.

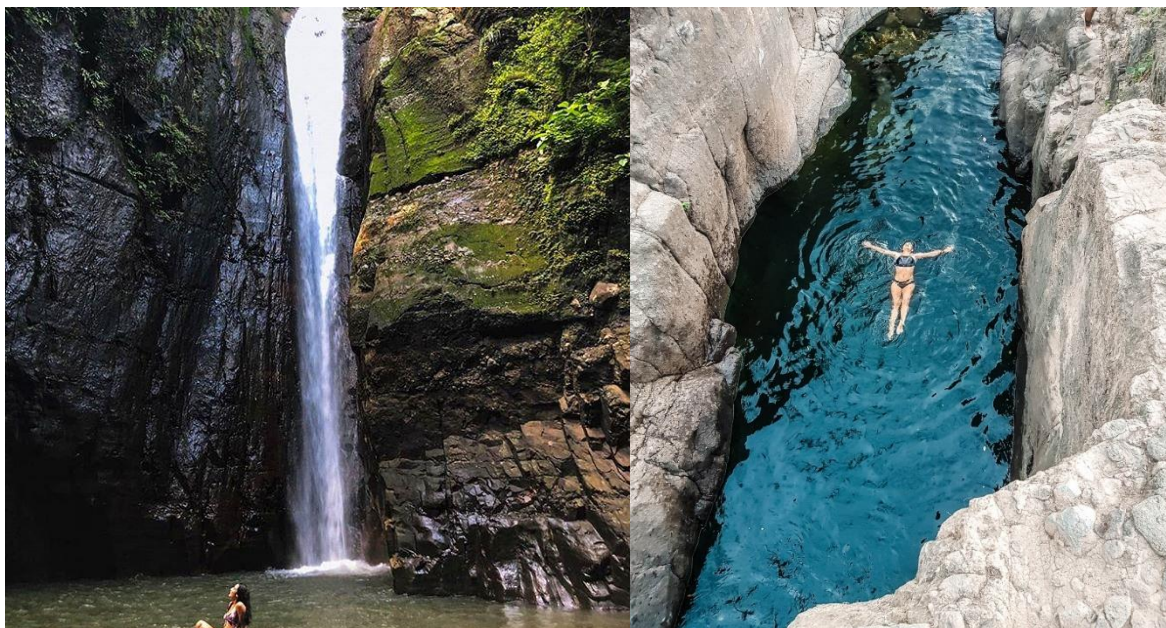

2. MAYAN TEMPLES TOUR & JUAYUA WATERFALLS

Overview: El Tazumal Archeological Site includes a series of structures which were the scenery of an important and sophisticated Mayan settlement that existed between 400 BC and 1200 BC. The vestiges include 2 pyramids, a ball court and other structures. Tazumal was a Mayan Regional Center, and even though the site was destroyed by Chalchuapa's new settlement, some history was able to be rescued.

Juayua is a small town with pleasant weather and natural beauty, waterfalls, food festivals, and a variety of entertainment during the weekends. Its name in Nahuatl language means "River of Orchids Dwellings".



Chorros de Calera is a series of impressive waterfalls, which are 10 mins from town. The driving distance is shorter than a hike.

3. VOLCANO HIKING TOUR



El Salvador has 23 volcanoes, but just a few are active. In this tour we'll visit the Ilimatepec Volcano, the highest volcano in the country and one of the few active volcanoes. An exciting adventure to the top of the Ilimatepec Volcano, a real scenic gem. It's the highest and largest of the coastal mountain range. Reaches 2382 masl. An

eruption of the volcano during late Pleistocene or early Holocene, produced a massive debris avalanche that got swept into the Pacific, forming the Acajutla Peninsula.

This Tour departs from La Libertad at 8:30am to Cerro Verde National Park, from there, the hike begins at 10:30am.
